

## CBI Communal Prayer Service, May 3, 2014 - Feast of James and Philip

### **Opening Prayer**: (Prayer Leader)

Lord we praise you for the great faith in action of Philip who along with Peter was the first to bring your Easter Presence to the north beyond Judea. Like Philip, may we see you truly and know that in seeing you, we see the Father. And Lord, we praise you for the true faith of James, whose Jewish approach to faith moves us to the heart of your love: to trust in you so much that we master ourselves in loving service of those You call us to love. Like your creation may we know and love you in silence and in work.

## Responsorial Psalm 19:2-3, 4-5

**Refrain (Cantor)**: The heavens declare the 'glory of 'God; and the firmament pro'claims his han'di'work, Alle"'lu'ia. (All repeat)

**Right**: The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork. Day pours out the word to day; and night to night imparts knowledge. (All: Refrain)

**<u>Left</u>**: Not a word nor a discourse whose voice is not heard; Through all the earth their voice resounds, and to the ends of the world, their message. (All: Refrain)

#### Gospel: John 14:6-14

Reader1: Jesus said to Thomas, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him."

Reader 2: Philip said to him, "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father.

Reader 3: How can you say, 'Show us the Father'?

Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me?

The words that I speak to you I do not speak on my own.

The Father who dwells in me is doing his works.

Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else, believe because of the works themselves.

Reader 4: Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father.

And whatever you ask in my name, I will do, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son.

If you ask anything of me in my name, I will do it."

Let this be my only consolation – that, where I am,
You my Lord are loved and praised.
The trees indeed love You without knowing You.

## Reading: John 1:1-5, 10-14, 16-18

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was in the beginning with God. <sup>3</sup> All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being <sup>4</sup> in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. <sup>5</sup> The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

<sup>10</sup> He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. <sup>11</sup> He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. <sup>12</sup> But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, <sup>13</sup> who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. <sup>14</sup> And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

<sup>16</sup> From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. <sup>17</sup> The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. <sup>18</sup> No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

# Responsorial: Psalm 119:9-16 "The Glories of God's Law"

Ref.: I will delight in your statutes; I will not forget your word.

- <sup>9</sup> How can young people keep their way pure? By guarding it according to your word.
- <sup>10</sup> With my whole heart I seek you; do not let me stray from your commandments. **Ref.**
- <sup>11</sup> I treasure your word in my heart, so that I may not sin against you.
- <sup>12</sup> Blessed are you, O LORD; teach me your statutes. **Ref.**
- <sup>13</sup> With my lips I declare all the ordinances of your mouth.
- <sup>14</sup> I delight in the way of your decrees as much as in all riches. **Ref.**
- <sup>15</sup> I will meditate on your precepts, and fix my eyes on your ways.
- <sup>16</sup> I will delight in your statutes; I will not forget your word. **Ref.**

**Leader** In every prayer we make, let your word fill us with grace and power. Hear us as we pray,

All Fill our hearts, Lord.

**Leader** In every way you speak to us --especially in Scripture, worship, and in the voices of those we serve-- let us recognize and embrace your word. Hear us as we pray,

All Fill our hearts, Lord.
