
Gospel Reading (Matt 7:1-5, 7-12)

Leader: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples, "Stop judging, that you may not be judged. For as you judge, so will you be judged, and the measure with which you measure will be measured out to you. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, 'Let me remove that splinter from your eye, while the wooden beam is in your eye?' You hypocrite, remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter from your brother's eye."

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.

Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you ill or in prison and visit you?' And the King will say to him in reply, 'Amen I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.'" -- The Gospel of the Lord.
