
Draw near to

ALL: Lord Jesus, you are the master of life and death. Everything we have is yours. Just one touch from you restores the sick, heals the broken, and transforms the darkness. Only you can do this. Only you. So we ask that you would be with us right now, that we may sense your presence, your power, your love. We have become partners of Christ if only we hold the beginning of the reality firm until the end, for it is said: "Oh, that today you would hear his voice: 'Harden not your hearts as at the rebellion.' Who were those who rebelled when they heard? Was it not all those who came out of Egypt under Moses? With whom was he "provoked for forty years"? Was it not those who had sinned, whose corpses fell in the desert? And to whom did he "swear that they should not enter into his rest," if not to those who were disobedient? And we see that they could not enter for lack of faith. The Word of the Lord. **ALL: Thanks be to God.**

Responsorial: Psalm 23

ALL/Response: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

Women:	The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. In verdant pastures he gives me repose; beside restful waters he leads me; he refreshes my soul. (<i>Response</i>)
