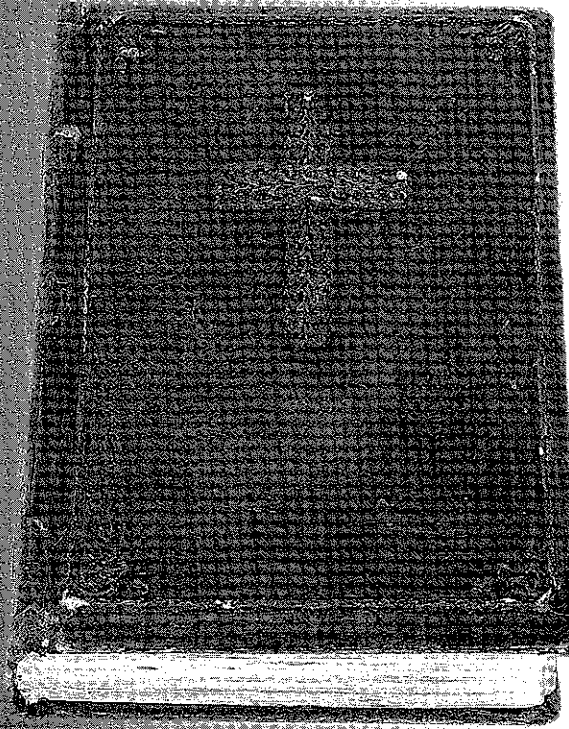

comprehensive study of the Hebrew and Christian
Scriptures, with particular focus on methods of
study, sharing and praying with Scripture, and
application of skills in bible-study leadership

Year one includes an introduction to the Hebrew
scriptures and an overview of the following themes:
Intro to the Hebrew Scripture, Pentateuch and Torah,
Historical Writings, Prophets, Exile and Rebuilding,
Deutero-canonical Writings, Wisdom Literature and
Hebrew Theology.

Year two includes an introduction to the New
Testament and an overview of the following: Mark,
Matthew, Luke/Acts, Johannine Writings, Pauline
Writings, Disputed Letters, Pastoral Letters,
Revelation, Early Christian Writings and New
Testament Theology.

Year three focuses on developing practical skills
for working with groups, with an emphasis on adult
learning, facilitation skills, group process, working
with bible-study resources, and leadership training

- To grow in appreciation of God's revealed Word
- To foster a Catholic understanding of the study of Scripture
- To integrate bible-study with prayer and Christian living
- To provide formation and training for parish-based bible study
