A. Ecumenism

The restoration of unity among all Christians is one of the principle concerns of the Second Vatican Council. (Decree on Ecumenism #1). In this workshop Father Burns will offer some history and insights into the ways in which this document has influenced Catholic and interfaith dialogue and experience in the past half century. Dr. Robert Burns is Chairperson of the Religious Studies Program. He received his PhD in theology from the University of Iowa. He teaches Comparative Religions (Judaism, Christianity, and Islam), Christian Literature and Thought, Epistles of St. Paul and Catholic Thought in the 20th Century. Among his publications are the following books: Roman Catholicism: Yesterday and Today (Loyola University Press) Roman Catholicism after Vatican II (Georgetown University Press) Catholic Spirituality and Prayer in the Secular City (University Press of America) Christianity, Islam, and the West (University Press of America)

B. Tradition and Progress in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy

This presentation will consider how the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy has shaped, not only the way we celebrate the Liturgy, but how we see ourselves as Church. Special attention will be given to six fundamental, guiding principles of the Liturgical Reform found in the document.

Reverend Jeff Wocken, S.D.S., professed vows in the Society of the Divine Savior in 1994 and was ordained to the ministerial priesthood in 1999. In 2006, he earned a Master of Arts degree in Liturgical Studies, with a thesis entitled, "Unity and Diversity in Catholic Liturgy: The Essential Role of the Local Assembly in Forming and Celebrating the Church's Worship." After serving in parish ministry and province administration, Fr. Jeff joined the Jordan Ministry Team in August, 2012.

C. The Light Still Burning: Lumen Gentium and Gaudium et Spes

The wisdom of Lumen Gentium and Gaudium et Spes shines as brightly today as when these documents were first promulgated. Both offer important insights on the role of the laity in the Church and in the world today. In the time we have we will reconnect with these encouraging and challenging documents and explore their relevance to our lives today. *Peggy Guerrero* has served as a teacher and administrator in Catholic schools for over 25 years. She has been working for the past 7 years in the Diocese of Tucson in adult faith formation. Other ministerial roles includes as retreat leader, parish council and board mentor, catechist training, RCIA resources and adult sacrament preparation resource.

Sr. Jane Eschweiler, SDS, is Director of the Jordan Ministry Team, has an M.A. in Pastoral Studies, and has worked as a high school teacher, retreat leader, parish administrator and pastoral associate. She is a spiritual director and has presented many workshops throughout the diocese in theology, teaching, scripture, etc.

D. Un Nuevo Rostro de la Iglesia Español

El mundo en su constante devenir vive cambios. Nuestra Iglesia Católica, movida por el Espíritu Santo, no es ajena a esos cambios y nos muestra un nuevo rostro a raíz del Concilio Vaticano II.

Msgr. Carlos Romero Moreno pertenece a la Diócesis de Margarita (Venezuela). Es Licenciado en Liturgia por el Pontificio Instituto de Liturgia de Barcelona (España). De sus 35 años de sacerdocio, siete los vivió al servicio de esta Diócesis de Tucson (2003-2010) como Vicario Parroquial de la Catedral "San Agustín" y profesor del Common Formation Program. Actualmente es Vicario Cooperador de la Iglesia "San Juan Evangelista" en su Diócesis de Margarita y Director de la Escuela de Diaconado Permanente y Ministerios Laicales. Entre su publicaciones se pueden citar: "Liturgia para Laicos", "Reflexiones sobre el Amor y la Familia", "Al servicio de los pobres", "Algunas Respuestas Católicas".

E. Dei Verbum: Scripture in the Life of the Church and the World

This presentation will remind us of the "importance of hearing the Word of the God reverently and proclaiming it confidently." (*Dei Verbum*, Prologue). Father Just will outline the key elements of this important Constitution which opened the Word of God to us in a more profound way.

Reverend Felix Just, S.J. was raised in Tucson and is a member of the California Province of the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits). He is the Director of Biblical Education at the Loyola Institute for Spirituality in Orange, CA. He holds a Ph.D. in New Testament Studies from Yale University and has taught at Loyola Marymount University (Los Angeles), the University of San Francisco, and Santa Clara University. He regularly teaches in Adult Faith formation programs in the southwest and the Catholic Bible Institutes of several dioceses in California. He is webmaster for the Catholic Biblical Association of America, and also maintains his website of "Catholic Resources" (http://catholic-resources.org).

F. Decree on the Apostolate of the Laity and Familiaris Consortium

This workshop will highlight the special and indispensable role of the laity in the church. The discussion will include the varieties of services, apostolates and ministries of lay people especially s they effect the family and young people today. Tricia Hoyt is Director, Evangelization and Adult Formation at St. Patrick Catholic Community in Scottsdale, Arizona. She is a Ph.D. Candidate in Biblical Interpretation at Bright Divinity School, has worked in parish and diocesan ministry for over twenty years. She is co-author of Ministry of Mothers Sharing books. She is married and has four adult children.

G. Decree on the Missionary Activity of the Church

"The Church on earth is by its very nature missionary" (Decree on Missionary Activity). In this workshop Father Sean will invite us to consider the many missionary activities the church is called to within our neighborhoods, cities, county, state and world. Rev. Sean Carroll, S.J. is a Jesuit priest of the California Province and is Executive Director of the KINO BORDER INITIATIVE, a Catholic bi-national migrant ministry in Nogales, Arizona and Nogales, Sonora, Mexico.
